Announcing our Teachers' Mining Tour Partnership

Mining Matters, the Ontario Mining Association and the Canadian Ecology Centre have created a new partnership. **Mining Matters** will implement and participate in the planning, promotion and delivery of the Teachers' Mining Tour, an innovative and fully-sponsored professional development program.

Tours introduce teachers to modern mining practices and industry professionals, promote understanding of the mine cycle and careers and enable teachers to make curriculum connections. In 2017, three tours are planned for the month of August: one in the North Bay area, focused on Earth science, mineral resources, prospecting and the mining service and supply sector; one in Timmins or Sudbury, centered on operating mines, milling, refining, smelting and reclamation; and one in Thunder Bay, again themed around operating mines and processing, with an overnight stay on-site to experience life in a mining camp. Exploring Earth Science at Wunnumin Lake First Nation

In late October **Mining Matters** spent a fun-filled week with the students of Lydia Lois Beardy Memorial School in Wunnumin Lake First Nation. Students participated in activities examining rocks and minerals, learning how to use a compass, creating geological maps and many more hands-on activities. Representatives from Goldcorp joined the group to give a snapshot of their careers at Musselwhite Mine and share information about their path of education and work experiences that led them to the mining industry. Careers showcased included millwright, geologist, manager of sustainability and environment, and environment coordinator.

A notable highlight was the headframe challenge activity, where the winning team built a structure out of straws, tape, string and paper that lifted an incredible 70 marbles!

The program was a resounding success, as one 12-year-old girl told us, "Your program is lots of fun. Hope you guys come back next year. I learned so much about mining."

Inspiring Dehcho Students with Earth Science Programs



Mining Matters partnered with Dehcho First Nation and the Government of the Northwest Territories to deliver an exciting series of Earth science and mineral resources education programs. The programs inspired students to further their education with a view to seizing opportunities within the NWT's mineral exploration and mining sector.

High school students in Fort Liard, Fort Simpson and Fort Providence participated in a full-day of classroom-based learning involving interactive activities focused on rocks and minerals and their importance in everyday life, local geology and the mining sequence. A special activity taught students about diamond-bearing deposits and modern technology as it is applied to the discovery, extraction and processing of these resources.

There was specific emphasis on current mining projects in the NWT and the wide range of careers offered by the industry. Students explored job roles, education requirements and salaries of many occupations in the minerals industry. Peer-to-peer interviews helped student understand how interests and skills can tie into a chosen career path. Many students stayed after school to enjoy soapstone carving and amethyst jewelry making.

Mining Matters looks forward to continued expansion in the NWT.
