Mining Matters in Ouje-Bougoumou First Nation and Chibougamau, Quebec

In February 2014, for the first time, **Mining Matters** partnered with BlackRock Metals Inc., Cree Human Resources Development Department, Ouje-Bougoumou Cree Nation and Waapihtiiwewan School, to inform youth about the mining industry, the local opportunities provided by the new BlackRock projects and other natural resource opportunities. **Mining Matters** traveled to Ouje-Bougoumou First Nation and MacLean Memorial School in Chibougamau, Quebec, reaching 212 students, teachers and community members over the four-day period. The program featured smaller group sessions at the school, an evening adult program and a community night event, to accommodate the high level of interest expressed by the community.
